I am a Licensed Clinical Psychologist and founder of Neurodevelopmental Assessment & Consulting Services (NACS) specializing in the diagnostic evaluation of individuals with and at risk for autism and related neurodevelopmental disorders. I am an avid teacher and trainer,

having conducted hundreds of seminars and workshops nationally and internationally. I have written two books and developed the Third Edition of the Vineland Adaptive Behavior Scales, the world's most widely used measure of adaptive functioning. My roles contribute to clinical service in the following ways:

- As the founder of NACS, I conduct and oversee all clinical and diagnostic evaluations for my practice.*
- I provide consulting services to organizations seeking assistance in program development, as well as to scientific grants for clinical characterization and phenotyping for individuals with neurodevelopmental disorders.*
- I provide training workshops and continuing education seminars on topics related to autism spectrum disorders and adaptive behavior profiles in neurodevelopmental disorders.*
- I provide local, regional, national, and international consultation on the detection, assessment, and treatment of individuals with autism spectrum disorders.*
- As an author of the Vineland Adaptive Behavior Scales, Third Edition (the world's most widely used measure of adaptive behavior), I train professionals on the Vineland-3 at institutional, regional, national, and international levels. I am also a consultant for the Japanese translation of the Vineland-3.*
- I teach an advanced undergraduate seminar on autism spectrum disorders at Emory University within the Department of Psychology.*
- From 2011 - 2017, I built a large-scale clinical research infrastructure for the Marcus Autism Center, including the recruitment, training, and management of over 50 clinicians and staff that provide clinical services to children and families participating in research.*
- Through clinical research endeavors at Marcus, I coordinated access to early diagnostic evaluations to hundreds of infants and toddlers with or at risk for autism prior to the age of 3, including provision of diagnosis and referral for treatment and intervention when indicated. I also coordinated and helped to conduct comprehensive diagnostic evaluations for over 1000 school-age children, adolescents, and young adults participating in research protocols.*
